

California Central Valley Maltese Club Membership Application

SINGLE MEMBERSHIP: Open to all persons eighteen (18) years of age and older who enjoy all the privileges of the Club including the right to vote and hold office.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP: Open to all persons eighteen (18) years of age and older who reside outside the California Central Valley. Associate members cannot vote or hold office and do not count in the determination of a quorum.

JUNIOR MEMBERSHIP: Open to all persons 10 through 17 years of age. Junior members cannot vote or hold office and do not count in the determination of a quorum. Junior members may convert to Single members upon reaching 18 years of age.

Applicants must not be under disciplinary censure or suspension of rights at the AKC. It is not necessary to be a "member" of the AKC, but anyone who has had their rights of AKC showing, AKC registering, AKC breeding, or participating in AKC events suspended or revoked may not join the California Central Valley Maltese Club (CCVMC) until those restrictions are removed.

Applicants must endorse and abide by the AKC Code of Sportsmanship, below.

Applicants must agree to abide by the CCVMC Objectives, Constitution, Bylaws, and Standing Rules.

Associate membership is governed in the same way as regular membership and if you do not adhere to these guidelines, charges may be brought against you and the CCVMC Board has the right to suspend your membership. If the CCVMC Board of Directors receives a concern from the membership and subsequently determines your participation is not in accordance with the objectives and purposes of the CCVMC, they have the right to deny your application.

Membership in the CCVMC is granted at the discretion of the members, so it is important that you understand your commitment to participate and support the organization.

Both regular and associate members may elect to serve as volunteers on committees, contribute to fund-raising activities, volunteer to help at a CCVMC sponsored event, or support the club in public events. CCVMC encourages all members to attend meetings and participate in discussions and make their viewpoints known. All member support is needed and appreciated. Members are kept informed through the Club Meeting Minutes via email. The membership process is lengthy and your patience is appreciated. The Secretary will notify you once your application has been processed.

AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.
